In November 2004, the Walton & Tipton Township Public Library opened its new doors for the first time to the public. The 6,400-square-foot addition nearly doubled the size of the existing structure. It has been the only major expansion project for the library since its inception in 1915.

Along with a new entrance facing U.S. 35, the library became ADA-compliant by adding new sidewalks and electronic doors. A lift was installed, allowing people to have easy access to the various levels.

The Children's Library area increased in size while a staff work area was added. The main part of the Adult Library—fiction and nonfiction—is housed in the new addition as well as the circulation desk.

The lower level features a Community Room and kitchenette, which can be rented out for meetings, parties, and other events.





Gingerbread House Guidelines

AREAS TO BE JUDGED

1) Overall Appearance, 2) Originality and Creativity, 3) Difficulty, 4) Precision and 5) Consistency of Theme.

NO THEME

There is no theme. Competitors are welcome and encouraged to uniquely design their entry for the 2024 Competition. Name and age must be provided with each entry on a separate sheet of paper. Library staff will separate entries based upon age, per category rules. Entries – with the exception of ages – will remain anonymous to voters and judges.

SIZE LIMITATIONS

Entry must be placed on a board base. Entries, combined with a base, must not be larger than 24 inches high, 24 inches wide, and 24 inches long. ½" or ¾" plywood as a base for your entry is recommended, but not necessary.

MATERIALS AND CONSTRUCTION

Please read carefully.

Everything above the base of your entry must be composed completely of edible materials.

The main structure of your entry must be constructed of at least 75% gingerbread, some of which should be exposed.

Edible materials are not limited to candies and icings. Use of gum paste, fondant, pastillage, chocolate, modeling chocolate, royal icing, isomalt, cast sugar, gelatin and pressed sugar is encouraged. Use of "Disco Dust," "Rainbow Dust," or "Hologram Powder" is permitted.

Due to the danger of working with hot sugar, techniques using poured hot sugar or isomalt are reserved for the teen and adult categories only. This includes melted sugar candies.

Any entry with non-edible components or using unapproved techniques will be automatically disqualified from placing in the competition. No artificial display materials, such as Styrofoam, interior lighting or other electronic components are to be used in the construction or decoration of the entry.

Candies must be unwrapped. Non-edible materials such as paint and/or ribbon are approved and encouraged to decorate the outer edge of your plywood or cardboard base only. Decorations must not cause the entry to exceed the required size limitations.

Entries must be solely constructed by the individual(s) entering the competition. Teen, Youth and Child competitors may be supervised, for safety precautions, by a parent, legal guardian, or classroom teacher. Example: assistance with operating a stove top or oven.

DEADLINE

All entries must be transported to the Walton Library and ready to be put on display by 5 p.m. Friday, December 13th. Voting will begin at 10 a.m. Saturday, December 14th and continue through 5 p.m. Friday, December 27th. Winners will be notified on December 27th (or when school is back in session after Christmas break). All submissions should be picked up no later than 12 p.m. Saturday, December 28th.
